

Amy Johnson Ely is the executive director of the Palmetto Cycling Coalition (PCC), a non-profit organization that is dedicated to making South Carolina bicycle and pedestrian friendly. Ely has been the executive director for more than 8 years. PCC works with statewide partners to advance pedestrian and cycling safety initiatives in South Carolina's legislature. Ely says her proudest achievement was a group effort that successfully advocated for the development of bicycle and pedestrian safety policies with the South Carolina Department of Transportation and a \$5 million-dollar annual investment toward building a safer South Carolina for non-motorized vehicles and pedestrians.

During the legislative session this year, PCC has its work cut out for it. For the past 4 years, PCC has worked to enact the SC Hands-Free Act, which would outlaw the use of a wireless device while operating a vehicle, though drivers may still place a call with a single swipe on a phone using a hands-free device, Bluetooth devices, headphones, or an earpiece. The goal of the bill would be to decrease distracted driving and make our roads safer for pedestrians and bicyclists, a worthwhile goal as SC is currently in the top 10 most dangerous states for pedestrians in the US. PCC will also be working to pass the 3 Feet to Pass Bill, which will define the safe distance to pass a bicyclist on the road as 3 feet.

Case Results

Drunk Driving Crash - Action Steps

We resolved a case last year where a drunk driver crashed into the back of two people on a moped, killing our client and severely injuring her driver. The couple was on their way home from work at a local diner when the crash occurred.

The drunk driver was uninsured and did not have anything in the way of assets. Moreover, neither our client nor the moped owner had insurance coverage. We were facing a situation where two children had been deprived of their single, working mom, but there was no auto insurance to pay a dime.

From the outset, we were investigating where the drunk driver had been in the hours leading up to the crash as we sought to determine whether a bar or restaurant had "overserved/oversold" the intoxicated driver. Through a lucky break and lots of work, we were able to pin down the driver's exact whereabouts, identify the bar that got him wasted, and recover the policy lim-

its from the bar's insurance carrier. Chris Pracht, who represented the profoundly injured moped driver, did a great job navigating the settlement process for his client, and our clients split the overall recovery.

In handling this and other DUI crash cases, we've seen that a set of clear action steps go a long way toward holding all responsible parties accountable. We have a long checklist that we're glad to share with any plaintiff's lawyer who wants it, but big picture-wise the key is to identify all witnesses, establish timelines, obtain all videos, preserve all evidence, work with law enforcement and all other potential allies, consult good experts, and treat the case like it involves a "dram shop" until definitively proven otherwise.
